




PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN ELECTORS

The General Elections 2024 have concluded, with the election of 74 women MPs into the 18th Lok Sabha. In this final factsheet, we look at the participation of women electors in the just concluded election across all states and union territories.


1. The overall voter turnout in the General Elections 2024 was 65.79%, with male voter turnout of 65.80% and **female voter turnout of 65.78%**

3. Lakshadweep, with **85.47%**, has the highest **female voter turnout** followed by Assam (81.71%), and Tripura (80.57%). Mizoram recorded the lowest female voter turnout of 55.67%, followed by Jammu and Kashmir (56.38%), and Gujarat (56.56%)



2. 19 states and union territories had higher female voter turnout than male voter turnout.

4. Bihar (6.11%), Jharkhand (4.88%), and Meghalaya (4.45%) had the highest positive difference between female and male voter turnout. Maharashtra (-4.11%), Madhya Pradesh (-5.13%), and Gujarat (-6.96%) had the highest negative difference.




5. Dhubri (Assam) has the highest female voter turnout in the country at **92.17%**. The lowest female voter turnout is in Srinagar at **33.21%**. The highest male voter turnout (91.99%) was also recorded in Dhubri.

6. 207 constituencies had higher female voter turnout than male, whereas the remaining 336 constituencies had higher male voter turnout.

Kodarma (Jharkhand): Female voter turnout was **15.85 percentage points higher** than male voter turnout, the highest in the country.

Porbandar (Gujarat): Female voter turnout was **11.12 percentage points lower** than male voter turnout, the highest in the country.
